





In 1865, Phillips Brooks, a 19th century preacher, journeyed to the Holy Land, where he rode a horse from Jerusalem to Bethlehem on Christmas Eve. He visited the field where (it is said) the shepherds saw the angel, and remained for midnight services at the Church of the Nativity. He found the whole experience quite moving. Three years later, inspired by memories of Bethlehem, he wrote the words for this hymn in one brief sitting.
